Your task is to choose any three boxes to complete as long as it forms a tic-tack-toe line. Your line may be horizontal, vertical, or diagonal. Make sure to read all the boxes and choose the tic-tack-toe line that most interests you.

Write an acrostic poem about the climax of the novel.	Pretend that you are the author and write a descriptive paragraph about the part of the book that was the most interesting to write.	Create and design a new book jacket for your novel. The book jacket must include the title, authors name, a picture and a new summary for the back.
Create a theme song that reflects the theme and mood of the novel.	Perform a skit showing the resolution of the novel. (You will want to find other students who have chosen this one to join your group).	Complete a reflective journal entry about how you felt after reading this novel. Include whether you enjoyed the novel or not and why . Also, state whether or not you would recommend this novel for others to read and why . Be sure to use descriptive words.
Explain why you think that your novel would be a good one to include in a time capsule to be dug up in 100 years. Be creative!!	Create a collage (using magazines) that reveals the personality of the main character of the novel. You will need magazines, glue, scissors and a sheet of white construction paper).	Create and design a time-line surrounding the main events in your novel. It may be as decorative as you wish and it must include at least 8 different events that you think are important.
