In addition, you will find many references to Environment concerns and ideas about how these concerns affect you and your child on a personal level.

A truly interactive site, you and your child can participate in online quizzes designed to test your ability to identify animals given a number of clues, including an audio quiz where you identify animals from sounds if your computer is equipped with sound capabilities.

A special feature at this site is a link to information about how to take animal care to the ultimate and pursue a career in the field.

Due to the high content of graphics and sound, you and your child will want a graphical browser when visiting the SeaWorld site. All of the animal pictures are spectacularly presented and make the page come alive.
